<i>The Legend of the Indian Paintbrush</i>	By reading this book, students will explore and become aware of the Native American culture.
<i>Inside a Barn in the Country</i>	Students will be able to read along with the teacher and learn the English names of common farm animals.
<i>Set of 3 My First Words: Things That Go, At Home, and Words</i>	Students will learn the English names of common objects in the home and community, names of community members, and names of common animals.
Homophone Memory Game	Students will become familiar with different homophone pairs, and learn that one spoken word can have different meanings and spellings, which can be a hard concept to understand for ELLs.
Restaurant Role Play	Students will become familiar with the American currency, and with ordering and paying at a restaurant.
Easter Egg Time	Students will learn how to tell time by looking at a clock.
Opposite Pair Cards	Students will become familiar with common opposite pairs.
